LEAD PROGRAMMER LETTER



Welcome to the 18th annual TRANSlations: Seattle Trans Film Festival! This is a very important year for us and we are happy to share so many wonderful new films and events with our community!

I am deeply moved to have the opportunity to program this festival, which at the same time, I recognize as a great responsibility. After many years programming films in order to create community and dialogue between artists and audiences, I finally get to do it in the context of a festival with as much history as TRANSlations. I am very grateful to have worked alongside an insightful group of people who make up the Screening Committee, I also want to thank the immense dedication and talent of the Three Dollar Bill Cinema team. The work behind this festival comes from the commitment and love we all have towards film and our community.

We can proudly say that the festival has grown this year. We are showcasing around 80 films from Turtle Island, and 17 countries including Perú, Brazil, Colombia, Chile, México, Portugal, Taiwán, Cambodia, Spain, UK, Romania, Finland, Canada, Azerbaijan, Germany, France and Australia.

This year's festival theme is TRANS THROUGH TIME, a celebration of trans history in cinema, and to express our appreciation to our community we will be honoring Isabel Sandoval in-person with our inaugural TRANSlations Trailblazer Award. This theme is also the title of a special shorts film program that includes three films from the UCLA/Outfest Legacy Project, work from our jury members, and current independent filmmakers.

I highly recommend the special program ARTIST SPOTLIGHT: SIMON(E) JAIKIRIUMA PAETAU. It is our first program of the in-person portion of the festival scheduled for May 4th, at The Beacon in Columbia City. Simon(e)'s program includes the avant-garde and unique piece POSH starring Ronique, an homage to black trans women.

On May 5th, we have plenty of programming including the Industry Panel for filmmakers, AMPLIFYING OUR VOICES, with Daniel Sea, members of Outfest, Trans, Nonbinary & Intersex Summit at Outfest, Artless Media, and Trangender Film Center. The panel will be followed by an industry reception at The Beacon. Later, join us at the award ceremony and screening of our two Opening Night Films, and end the night with the exciting Opening Night party, featuring performances by Moscato Sky and Howie Echo-Hawk.

This year's feature films touch on themes about our valuable trans history. These films highlight the experiences of different generations that reveal particular realities, and evidence of a complex and layered trans universe.

I want to dedicate this festival to the memory of Rasheeda Williams, Koko Da Doll, protagonist of the movie KOKOMO CITY directed by D. Smith. Koko's art and legacy will continue to empower many Black trans women and the trans community through this beautiful film and we are honored to be able to share her story this year. Rest in Power Koko.

We have a strong shorts program lineup, which includes the block RESISTANCE/RESILIENCE. Following this power program, we invite the community to join us for a conversation in-person with Daniel Sea, our special guest for the 2023 TRANSlations.

In 2023, anti-trans bills continue to be introduced across the country doubling the numbers from last year. The immense stress and anxiety that this is causing to members of our community often goes unnoticed. I believe TRANSlations can help us find each other during these challenging times. Through film or any form of art, we have a say in the world we build for ourselves. To be active members of our society we need to find ways to celebrate our existence and be in solidarity with one another more than ever.

We hope that through all the films and events you'll experience by joining our festival, you can feel a sense of community; that you can feel empowered and inspired to keep sharing our stories to those you care about and to a world that needs to learn about our beautiful lives and legacies. Trans is beautiful!

Daniel Sea (he/they)

Daniel Sea (he/they) is a trans non-binary actor, musician and artist. Sea has worked in film, theater and TV series. They played the first recurring transmasculine role on television, appearing from 2006-2009 as Max in Showtime's The L Word. In 2022, he revised his role as Max for the current iteration of the L Word: Generation Q. They acted in films such as John Cameron Mitchell's "Shortbus", and Barbara Albert's film "The Dead and The Living/Die Lebenden."

In collaboration Marissa Lobô, Jota Mombaça, Juliana dos Santos, and with participation from artist Ani Gonzaga, and activist Sonia Guajajara, Sea was a part of creating the theater piece "Ghost Times/Decolonizing Teatro Mundi", at the Brüt Theater in Vienna, Austria.

Sea is co-writer, producer and songwriter on "La La La Little Shows", a decolonial children's scifi series, which includes animation, music performance, narrative story telling and interviews with artists. This show centers BIPOC and Queer characters and artists.

As a conceptual artist, Sea works with interdisciplinary memoir, engaging in processes such as research-based performance, writing, music, drawing, video and photography. Prior to their work acting in mainstream tv and film, Sea came of age as an artist as a part of the queer punk, art and activist scenes of the San Francisco Bay Area, California in the 1990's. His work transverses from the queer vanguard to the mainstream, intervening on pop culture, infecting the mainstream with a political and magical queer and trans agenda.



dana washington-queen

(they/them)

dana washington-queen is a photographer and filmmaker working in poetic and documentary forms to render and celebrate black life and expression.



Frances Arpaia (she/her)

Frances Arpaia is a queer trans woman who lives in Brooklyn and makes weird films.

NARRATIVE SHORTS JURY



Max Disgrace (he/him)

Max Disgrace is an award-winning film director, a film programmer and trans man of Chinese descent, living in London. He has been selected as a Director for BFI Network x BAFTA Crew 2020/21, Berlinale Talents 2020 and the BFI Flare mentorship, and his work has been screened at the BFI, Tate Modern, the Barbican and at film festivals internationally.

Max has directed a new short film Dismantle Me associate produced by Lilly Wachowski (The Matrix, Bound) on this film he worked with with a majority trans and non-binary cast and crew, achieved in

collaboration with filmmaker directory: Trans+ On Screen.

Max's body of work has focused on the politics of queer sexual intimacies between marginalised bodies. Dismantle Me builds on this - focussing on nuanced experiences of romantic pleasure and desire between trans characters in narrative fiction.

His previous short film Ruptured premiered on underground film platform 4:3 Boiler Room, for which he was awarded the Wahala Film Fund grant – for Queer, Transgender and Intersex People of Colour filmmakers.



Danny Denial (she/her)

Danny Denial is a musician and filmmaker listed in Status Magazine as the "POC of the Queer Punk & Alternative Scene to Watch", and in Afropunk's "8 Punkest Bands on the Planet Right Now" list, as well as known for fronting Seattle band Dark Smith.



Moscato Sky (they/she)

The Them Fatale of Drag & Burlesque, Moscato Sky is a latinx, trans-femme, non-binary dancer, educator, and award winning choreographer based out of Seattle, WA. This tempting tart is one fourth of world renowned burlesque sensation Mod Carousel and was crowned The Noire Pageant 2020 Duchess of Burlesque. They were the first trans femme competitor at the Burlesque Hall of Fame and are the reigning Princess of Burlesque. This genderqueer goddex was voted on the 21st Century Burlesque Top 50 List of most influential

burlesque figures in the world since 2020 and is currently ranked at #18.

DOCUMENTARY/TRANSGENRE SHORTS JURY



Pol Merchan (he/him)

Pol Merchan (1980, Spain) is an artist, filmmaker, and film programmer for the Xposed International Queer Film Festival. He received his bachelor's degree in Fine Arts from the University of Barcelona and his master's degree from the Universität der Künste Berlin's Art in Context program. His audiovisual work examines visual semantics and cinematic processes while dissecting traditional filmmaking methods. Merchan's films have been exhibited internationally in art institutions and at numerous film festivals around the globe.

Catrileo + Carrion Community (Manuel Carrión-Lira & Antonio Catrileo Araya)

Communidad Catrileo+Carrion are queer/trans/nonbinary Indigenous epupillan (twospirit) beings who work articulating generative spaces of reciprocity and relationality. They honor the land and their ancestors through ceremonies materialized in their audiovisual, textile, editorial, curatorial, and community practices. Communidad Catrileo+Carrion reside divided between Pikunmapu/Qullasuyu (Valparaíso Region, Chile) and Kumeyaay Territory (San Diego, California, USA). The group is currently composed of Antonio Catrileo Araya, Constanza Catrileo Araya, Malku Catrileo Araya, Alejandra Carrión Lira, and Manuel Carrión Lira.



Antonio Catrileo (they/them)

Antonio Catrileo (they/them) is a Mapuche writer, artist, and weaver from Pikunmapu/ Qullasuyu (Curico, Chile). Currently is a student at the PhD in Ethnic Studies at the University of California San Diego. They hold a B.A., M.A. in Chilean and Hispanic Literature at Pontificia Universidad Católica de Valparaíso. Author of the book "Awkan epupillan mew: dos espíritus en divergencia" (2019) and "Diáspora"(2015). Member of the Catrileo+Carrión Community, where they have collectively published the books "Poyewün Nütramkan Pikunmapu/Qullasuyu"

(2020), "Poyewün witral: bitácora de las tejedoras de Neltume" (2019), "Torcer la palabra: escrituras obrera-feministas" (2018) and "Yikalay pu zomo Lafkenmapu" (2018). Currently is a collaborator of Global Center for Advanced Studies Latin America Collective. Their work is presented as a critical intervention in how colonial categories have been imposed on notions of sexuality and gender in the Mapuche context. Catrileo claims the word epupillan (two-spirit) as a generative practice that focuses on not reproducing the damage of the archive's narratives in order to imagine a Mapuche futurity beyond the politics of recognition, nation, and identity. Epupillan is a situated knowledge shared by several elders who are HIV/AIDS activists and defenders of the land.



Manuel Carrión Lira (he/they)

Manuel Carrión Lira (he/they) is a Pikunche researcher, video-artist and curator from Pikunmapu/Qullasuyu (Quillota, Chile). They are currently a Fulbright International Fellow studying in the PhD in Literature at the University of California San Diego. Manuel holds a M.A. in Latin American Art, Thought and Culture from the Instituto de Estudios Avanzados at Universidad de Santiago de Chile, and a B.A. in Design at Universidad de Valparaíso. Member of the Catrileo+Carrión Community, where they

have collectively published the books "Poyewün Nütramkan Pikunmapu/Qullasuyu" (2020), "Poyewün witral: bitácora de las tejedoras de Neltume" (2019), "Torcer la palabra: escrituras obrera-feministas" (2018) and "Yikalay pu zomo Lafkenmapu" (2018). Manuel is part of the Global Center for Advanced Studies Latin America Collective. Manuel's work focuses on Indigenous Media at the intersection with Trans-indigenous/Transnational kinship networks beyond the nation-state framework, all of this with special attention to queer/trans/2S/epupillan Indigenous cultural production.

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OPENING NIGHT SCREENING KOKOMO CITY



D. Smith 2023, United States, 73 min.

Directed by two-time Grammy nominee D. Smith, KOKOMO CITY takes up a seemingly simple mantle — to present the stories of four Black transgender sex workers in New York and Georgia. Shot in striking black and white, the boldness of the facts of these women's lives and the earthquaking frankness they share complicate this enterprise, colliding the everyday with cutting social commentary and the excavation of long-dormant truths.

Accessible for any audience, unfiltered, unabashed, and unapologetic, Smith and her subjects smash the trendy standard for authenticity, offering a refreshing rawness and vulnerability unconcerned with purity and politeness.

Vacationing with the family can be one of the biggest challenges when you are still in the process of finding your autonomy. This is the case for Ren, an aspiring writer in her twenties who has been recently fired from her job and decides to spend a few days with her sister and her parents at a lake house. Ren's inner world is constantly disturbed by outside forces and characters who don't see her for who she is. This debut film by Luis De Filippis stands out for her work directing actors and writing. It is a film that is limited to a small and sometimes claustrophobic physical space, but that investigates the vast complexities of intra-family relationships from a trans perspective. It will remain fresh in the audience's mind for many years to come.

"Something You Said Last Night is about love, embarrassment, shame, failing to see people even as they stand before you, and learning how to be an adult while still being your parent's child. I'm so excited for the world to see what happens when trans women tell our own stories. 

CENTERPIECE ARTIST SPOTLIGHT: SIMON(E) JAIKIRIUMA PAETAU



Simon(e) Jaikiriuma Paetau is a Colombian-German interdisciplinary artist. Their works are located between cinema, video installations, and performance and explore queer decoloniality. In this special program we review more than ten years of the multifaceted audiovisual work of Simon(e) Jaikiriuma Paetau, from one of their first short films, Mila Caos (2011), to their most recent film, Aribada (2022). Jaikiriuma Paetau's cinema is difficult to categorize since it moves in hybrid and indefinite spaces between narratives similar at times to that of Almodóvar's most memorable films, as well as taking from experimental documentary cinema and performance. Simon(e) Jaikiriuma Paetau creates a vividly colored universe where anything is possible, directing and engaging with their characters in a way that gives them a voice and agency. Each work selected as part of this program features strong characters who aren't afraid to look back at whoever is paying attention in a game of confrontation with the camera and the audience.

TRANSLATIONS TRAILBLAZER AWARD CEREMONY

Since TRANSlations is turning 18 this year, to celebrate our coming-of-age, we have created the TRANSlations Trailblazer Award, honoring the long history of trans representation on the big screen, and those artists within the film community whose work continues to inform, inspire, and challenge a new generation of filmmakers to keep fighting for their art.

For our inaugural recipient, there really was no other choice than Isabel Sandoval, one of the most fearless and impactful filmmakers of her time. From her feature films *Senorita* and *Lingua Franca*, to her directorial work on series like *Under the Banner of Heaven* and *Tell Me Lies*, Sandoval has blazed a path for herself both inside and outside of the studio system. In doing so, she has brought visibility, inspiration, and incredible filmmaking to our world.



Produced several years before the historic Stonewall uprising for LGBTQ rights in 1969, director Nikolai Ursin's gently-activist short provides an illuminating glimpse into the life of an African-American trans woman. In strong contrast to the stereotypically negative and hostile depictions of transgender people as seen through the lens of Hollywood at the time, the subject of Ursin's independent film is rendered as stable, hopeful, and well-adjusted.

TRANS (c. 1994)

Sophie E. Constantinou, 1994, USA, 9 min.

Henry, a trans man, muses about the narrow definitions of gender, femininity, sexual politics, and the joy of wearing a suit.

THE RIDE (2000)

Bill Basquin, 2000, USA, 9 min.

Sexual suggestion, intimate bravado, and emotional ambiguity underlie this meditative adventure story where the up-for-discussion gender of a small town cab driver is the focal point of conversation.

AT LEAST YOU KNOW YOU EXIST (2011)

Zackary Drucker, 2011, USA, 16 min.

Created inside an archeology of the uptown New York City apartment inhabited by legendary performer/drag queen Mother Flawless Sabrina, At least you know you exist (2011) is a site-specific exploration of a fixed space where everything is in a state of change.

Known as Jack to those close to him, he lived in the same apartment at 5 East 73rd Street for more than 45 years—a crowded, unwieldy place that fiercely pronounces his rejection of conformity. In this 16mm film, totemic mystical objects act as a collection of mysterious sculptures in different states of mutation, and rich layers of feverish history interface with a new vision of transgender performativity. Navigating the real and the unconscious, oscillating between documentary and myth narrative, Zackary Drucker weaves a fluid, parallel text of these two divergent lives, exploring a legacy being passed from a lost generation towards the future.

GOLDEN GOLDEN (2016)

Eric E.R. Cho, 2016, USA, 14 min.

Two broke San Bernardino 20-somethings make their way to Los Angeles to learn about their own secret desires, via a fortune teller's crystal balls. Through different settings and musical genres, space opens for their desires and love for one another to run free. Golden Golden was featured in Trans History in Objects: Trans Video Store, a special MOTHA (Museum of Trans History and Art) exhibition.

PIRATE BOYS (2018)

Pol Merchan, 2018, USA, 13 min.

Kathy Acker's writing, and a seminal portrait of her taken by intersex photographer Del LaGrace Volcano, provide a lens through which to explore trans subjectivity and the queering of cinema. Pol Merchan's hybrid documentary fluidly moves from the documentation of the punk era to a more performative exploration of gender.

A TRANS WITH A MOVIE CAMERA (2018) Frances Arpaia, 2018, USA, 13 min.

A non-narrative cine-essay that collaboratively explores potential for trans-feminine representation in film.

RESUME AT THE POINT OF INTERRUPTION (2022)

dana washington-queen, 2022, USA, 8 min.

This experimental documentary follows Black individuals, including the artist, as they intuit and improvise their way through the world. In the chapter on Washington-Queen, we see the queer nonbinary photographer receive hormone replacement therapy and meditate on themes of gender, difference, constraint, and freedom.


